Southern Indiana Pro Bono Referrals (SI-PBR) strives to promote equal access to justice for all Indiana residents by referring qualified residents with civil legal needs to pro bono resources.

Applicants' legal issues are prioritized on a case-by-case basis with top priority given to cases that may result in homelessness, involve the safety and health of children, or involve domestic violence.

Who qualifies for services:



At Southern Indiana Pro Bono Referrals (SI-PBR) we must determine if you are eligible for our services before we can attempt to place you with a pro bono attorney. SI-PBR applicants are screened for residency, financial need, case type, and potential legal merit.

Please note that eligibility with SI-PBR does not guarantee that your case will be placed with a volunteer attorney. You should make every attempt to continue or obtain private counsel of your own choosing.

- Divorce
- Paternity
- Custody
- Parenting
- Guardianships
- Wills/Powers of Attorney/Health Care
- Landlord/Tenant



SI-PBR does **NOT** accept cases within certain legal areas, including:

- Criminal Cases
- CHINS Cases
- Cases against the judicial system, criminal justice system, or any government entity
- Employment Law
- Personal Injury
