The Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana met in Regular Session on November 10, 2011 at 4:00 p.m. in Room 404, of the Clark County Government Building, Jeffersonville, Indiana.

Approval of Minutes

County Auditor R. Monty Snelling presented Minutes for October 27, 2011 Minutes for approval. Commissioner Moore made motion to approve. Commissioner Meyer seconded. Motion approved 2-0. Commissioner Young was absent.

Approval of Claims/Payroll

A. Mike Meyer, County Health Department appeared before the Board to present a \$5,000.00 Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) training grant for approval. Commissioner Moore made motion to approve. Commissioner Meyer seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

- **B. Commissioner Meyer** made motion to appoint John Prall to replace Theresa James on the Cemetery Commission. Commissioner Moore seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

- **E.** Auditor Report/Comments Auditor Snelling stated the Hold for Information Fund #326 still has balance and needs to be closed out.

Auditor Snelling also stated he spoke with County IT Administrator Matt Dyer regarding the county's servers. He stated Mr. Dyer stated the servers are in danger of crashing. Auditor Snelling stated the servers can be paid from the IT Fund #357. Commissioner Moore made motion to pay up to \$15,000.00 for replacements. Commissioner Meyer seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

Auditor Snelling submitted the Monthly Treasurer's Report. Commissioner Meyer made motion to enter into the record. Commissioner Moore seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

- **F. Brian Dixon** appeared before the Board to discuss flooding issues at 12704 Bennettsville Rd. Commissioner Meyer asked County Engineer Hyun Lee to work with Mr. Dixon on solutions and pricing.
- **G.** Attorney Reports/Comments Attorney Fifer stated after speaking with Auditor Snelling the General Fund should be okay at the end of the year as long as judgment funding come in as scheduled.
- **H. Officeholder/Department Heads Present at Meeting** County Council President Kevin Vissing stated he would like a Commissioner present at the next Council meeting to explain the transfer of funds regarding the highway department.
- I. Ratifications and Approvals Commissioner Meyer made motion to approve an agreement with Kentuckiana Regional Planning and Development Agency to conduct a Clark County thoroughfare

study. Cost is 80/20. The County's match could be up to \$40,000.00 in funding. Commissioner Moore seconded. Motion approved 2-0.
