

## **REGULAR MEETING**

### **CLARK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

March 12, 2026

The Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana met in Regular Session on March 12, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. in Room 103, Clark County Government Building, in Jeffersonville, Indiana.

Present at the meeting were Commissioners – Bryan Glover and David Decker, Commissioners' Assistant Sabrina Corbin, County Attorney Scott Lewis and Auditor Danny Yost.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Bryan Glover. Prayer was led by Commissioner David Decker.

#### **Approval of the Minutes**

**Commissioner Decker** motioned to approve February 26, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**Auditor Danny Yost** presented the claims and payroll for March 18, 2026. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the claims and payroll as presented by Auditor Danny Yost. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**Commissioner Glover** asked for any amendments to the agenda if not he would entertain a motion to approve. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0

**I. Public Comments:** No Public Comment.

**II. New Business:**

**A.** Commissioner Glover presented an Ordinance Establishing the HMGP23 Hazard Mitigation Grant Program for Clark County EMA. This is to approve fund 8177 for Ordinance number 10-2026. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, states the grant itself is for 24,304.00 with a local in-kind match of 8,128.60, so the total is 32,432.60. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve Ordinance 10-2026. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**B.** Scott Lewis, County Attorney, presented a Maintenance Agreement for Court Recording Equipment through JAVS for the Clark County Courts that was brought to us by the Court Administrator, Tom Lowe. The Maintenance Agreement would run from 3/1/2026 – 2/28/2027. The total amount for the Maintenance and Support Agreement for the Court Recording Equipment is 13,690.00, and Mr. Lowe indicated this is budgeted for in the court funds. This agreement would cover all the Courts. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the Maintenance Agreement for Court Recording Equipment. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**C.** Commissioner Glover presented a Supplemental Agreement No. 1 for the Charlestown Pike Project. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, points out this does not change the dollar amount of the original contract, this just extends the final completion date. The original completion date was 7/8/2025, the new final completion date would be 10/31/2026. If there is a winter shutdown, the dates would change from 11/14/24 – 4/1/2025 to 11/15/2025 – 1/15/2026. This was extended due to property acquisition and utility relocation. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the Supplemental Agreement No. 1 for the Charlestown Pike Project. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**D.** Commissioner Glover presented the Small Structure Replacement on Bean Road Contract for the Highway Department. Scott Lewis, County Attorney wanted to remind everyone we took quotes on this a couple of meetings ago because it was below the threshold for sealed public bidding. The low lump sum quote was Dan Christiani Excavating Co., Inc. for 59,221.00. They already voted to approve the quote, this is just to approve the contract. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the Small Structure Replacement on Bean Road Contract. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**E.** Commissioner Glover presented the Subrecipient Agreement Between Clark County and Ivy Tech Community College – Sellersburg for Opioid Restricted Funds. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, reminds everyone we

already voted to approve the request from Ivy Tech for their proposal. This is the Subrecipient Agreement that has all the binding legal terms that Ivy Tech will abide by the approved uses of the Opioid Restricted Funds from the Class Action Lawsuit. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the Subrecipient Agreement between Clark County and Ivy Tech – Sellersburg for Opioid Restricted Funds in the amount of 100,000.00. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**F.** Commissioner Glover presented the GSA Multiple Award Schedule Purchase Order for the Clark County Highway Department through Verizon Wireless. Sabrina Corbin, Commissioner's Administrator, explains that the current plan the Highway Department has is not on the State plan, and by switching to the State plan they won't have to worry about data usage. The pricing remains the same, but this will allow them more data to avoid congestion. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the GSA Multiple Award Schedule Purchase Order for the Clark County Highway Department. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**G.** John Benningfield and Matt Johns presented an Opioid Restricted Funds Request from Atlas Otium. They wanted to go on record that the MATRIX and WRAP programs will not be taught in house, they will be taught at the Clark County Jail. They are requesting 60,000.00 to move towards working through recovery works, as a full nonprofit, and not a certified half way house. Right now it's been ran as more of a room rental model, and it's been individually ran. They want the State oversight and support. With State oversight, if an individual isn't following program guidelines, they could be mandated to leave. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, wanted to clarify that they were asking for 60,000.00 annually, but we can't really do that. By law you would have to do one request at a time. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve the Opioid Restricted Funds Request from Atlas Otium and the standard Subrecipient Agreement for 60,000.00 for a period of one year, and allow President Glover to sign the subrecipient agreement. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**H.** Galadriel Ballard with Community Corrections requested a Letter of Support for IDOC Grants for Clark County Probation. It's a priority letter for

prioritization of funding for their IDOC Grants, which are due April 1<sup>st</sup>. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, wanted to clarify that this is an annual request. Commissioner Decker motioned to allow President Brian Glover to sign the letter of approval for the IDOC Grants. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

- I. Commissioner Glover presented a Commissioner appointment, on the recommendation of Chief Jason Cochran, for Dennis Ettel to be on the New Washington Fire Protection District. Commissioner Decker motioned to approve Dennis Ettel as the Clark County Commissioner's appointment to the New Washington Fire Protection District beginning March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2026 through the first Monday in January 2030. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

**III. Old Business:** None.

**Reports:**

- A. **Auditor:** Auditor, Danny Yost, has the Treasurer's report to enter into the record. Commissioner Decker made a motion to enter the Treasurer's report into the record. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.
- B. **Attorney:** None.
- C. **Highway Department:** Brian Dixon, Highway Engineer, stated that for the Charlestown Jeff Pike Project, all aerial utility relocations have been completed, water line is ahead of schedule, and the tree clearing will be completed by April 1<sup>st</sup>. Estimated completion date is September 7, 2026.
- D. **Sheriff:** Captain, Charlie Scott, presented the inmate count at 587 Total Inmates. That includes: 75 ICE holds, and 19 Federal Marshal holds.


