

REGULAR MEETING
CLARK COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
May 7, 2026

The Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana met in Regular Session on May 7, 2026, at 5:00 p.m. in Room 103, Clark County Government Building, in Jeffersonville, Indiana.

Present at the meeting were Commissioners – Bryan Glover, and Jack Coffman, Commissioners’ Assistant Sabrina Corbin, County Attorney Scott Lewis and Auditor Danny Yost.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Bryan Glover. Prayer was led by Commissioner Jack Coffman.

Approval of the Minutes

Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve April 23, 2026 Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

Auditor Danny Yost presented the claims and payroll for May 13, 2026. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the claims and payroll as presented by Auditor Danny Yost. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

Commissioner Glover asked for any amendments to the agenda if not he would entertain a motion to approve. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

I. Public Comments: No Public Comment.

II. New Business:

A. Dr. Yazel presented a Syringe Services Program Renewal for the Health Department. Their syringe return rate was 115% during the last time period. There have been some changes in legislation over the last year at the State level. So, moving forward all syringe programs will required to be a one to one exchange. There has also been some changes in the identification side of things. They do verify identities more stringently than they have in the

past with this new law. Overall overdose fatalities are down 71% in our County, which is one of the best in the State. Commissioner Coffman motioned to renew the Syringe Service Program for a time period of June 2026 to June of 2028. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

- B.** Brian Dixon, Highway Engineer, presented the 2025 Highway Annual Operational Report. The annual operational report is a summary of all the expenses and revenue streams for the Highway Department. They are required to turn a copy into LTAP by June 1st if every year. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve to approve the 2025 Highway Annual Operation Report. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.
- C.** Scott Lewis, County Attorney, presented the Small Structure Lining Contract for Decker Lane. At the last meeting, we opened up sealed quotes. The low quote was from Temple and Temple Excavating and Paving in the amount of \$73,345.00. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the contract with Temple and Temple Excavating and Paving for the lining of a structure on Decker Lane. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.
- D.** Scott Lewis, County Attorney, presented the Replacement and Reprogramming of Highway Department's Radios Quote. We have a quote for \$12,343.00 for the replacement and reprogramming of all the radios for the Highway Department with ERS Wireless. This is fixing the system we have instead of upgrading to the newer state system right now. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the proposal from ERS Wireless for the replacement and reprogramming of the Highway Department radios in the amount of \$12,343.00. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.
- E.** Scott Lewis, County Attorney, presented the Hwy 160 Patching Change Order. We have a current milling, patching, and paving project on County Road 160 with Hall Paving. The original contract amount was \$631,449.70. This would be a change order to that contract for \$15,750.00 for the correction of a void that drains across the roadway that acts as a culvert but it is not a culvert and needs to be filled in to prevent it from collapsing.

Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the change order from Hall Paving. The change order amount is \$15,750.00. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.

F. Scott Lewis, County Attorney, presented a Paper Shredding Quote for the Auditor's Office. We've been advised that the Auditor's Office, in the basement of the Judicial Center, have numerous documents that are well beyond the timeframe to be kept under the State's retention schedule that need to be destroyed. Under State law, when you destroy records, they have to be shredded or burned. Commissioner Coffman motioned to approve the contract with the Paper Predator for the destruction/shredding of 15 large boxes at \$99.00 each. Each additional large box at \$5.00 each, and each additional small box at \$3.00 each. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 2-0.


