MINUTES OF REGULAR BOARD MEETING OF THE CLARK COUNTY RECYCLING DISTRICT AUGUST 26, 2026

Call to Order:

The Meeting of the Clark County Recycling District was called to order by Board President Jennifer Voignier, at 5:00 pm. held in the Meeting Room #103, Clark County Government Center, 300 Corporate Dr., Jeffersonville, Indiana, on August 26, 2026.

Roll Call:

Roll call was conducted: The following Board Members were present: Jennifer Voignier, Bryan Glover, David Decker, Scott Anderson, and Jack Coffman. Board Members: Mike Moore and Steve Doherty were not present. Debby McGrath, Executive Director, Jeff Cox, Board Controller, Jake Elder, Board Attorney, and Darla Stahl, Board Secretary, were also present.

Unincorporated Area Recycling RFP Bids:

Board attorney Jake Elder opened the bids from: Gotta Go, Black Box Dumpster, Rumpke, and Estes Waste. A motion to take bids under advisement for the September board was made by Jack Coffman with David Decker seconding the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

Approval of Minutes:

Board member Jack Coffman made a motion to approve the CCRD Minutes from July 22, 2026 with David Decker seconding the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

Controller Report:

Jeff Cox discussed the expenses for the month of August. Motion to approve August 2026 claims in the amount of \$188,548.70 made by Bryan Glover with Jack Coffman seconding the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

Old Business:

Debby McGrath addressed the Board about Memphis drop-off site. After reviewing, it is recommended to keep the recycling drop off at the current site.

New Business:

A motion to accept the Interlocal Agreement between the Board of Commissioners of Clark County, IN, the Clark County Recycling District, and the Tri-Township Fire Protection District for paving services was made by Jack Coffman and seconded by Bryan Glover. Motion carried 5-0.

Attorney Report:

Mortgage Foreclosure Policy: After discussion, Jake advised the Board that a verbal motion was needed to keep the current policy in effect. A motion was made by Bryan Glover, seconded by David Decker, to keep the Mortgage Foreclosure Policy unchanged. Motion carried 5-0.

Executive Director Report:

Multifamily Recycling: Debby advised the Board and reviewed a handout outlining the CCRD's efforts to engage multifamily property owners in providing recycling opportunities for their residents. The matter will be revisited at the October meeting.
